

WORSHIP NOTES FROM FR. JENSON

This is the 1st Sunday of Advent and the Church's new year! Our Gospel readings switch from the Gospel of St. Mark to St. Luke. Last week, we ended the liturgical year focused on the last things and the Kingship of Jesus Christ.

As we begin the Church's new year, we focus on the beginning of God's plan of salvation for us through the birth of his Son at Bethlehem. Jesus came

down to save us from sin so that God might have us with him forever in the glory of heaven. But for that to happen, we must acknowledge Jesus as Lord and repent our sins.

John the Baptist was sent as the call to repentance for all to hear. Jesus would be baptized by John, showing us clearly that repentance is the key to heaven. We now

begin the short four-week season of Advent. Advent means coming or arriving. Like the wise virgins, we need to have our lamps filled with the oil of faith and love to meet the Lord on his birthday at Christmas!

The Rosary is perfect for deepening our faith during Advent, especially the Joyful Mysteries. If you struggle to find time for a whole Rosary, you could begin with a practice of saying three Hail Mary's a day. Our Blessed Mother, Mary, will help us to grow in the ability to love her son. Advent is the time to make the way of the Lord straight in our hearts. As we do this, the true meaning of Christmas can dawn upon us like the white dawn gently lightens the dark predawn sky as the sun's rising approaches the horizon.



FR'S CHALLENGE: PARISH CENTER ROOF & WINDOW REPAIR

Donations received to date: \$54,758.50

Thanks to the current donation amount, we've ordered/purchased materials to replace the flat roof. This is currently scheduled to be installed in January 2025.

\$200,214

Over the past year, significant maintenance issues have affected the Parish Center. The flat roof has been leaking, causing damage to shared spaces. The shingled roof is also in need of immediate attention, as the insurance agent has noted that the shingles are past their effectiveness. Additionally, the bottom portions of windows in the classrooms and parish offices have rotted off and require replacements.



Our immediate challenge is to rally 150 families to contribute \$900 each, aiming to **raise a total of \$135,000**. This collective effort will enable us to address the urgent maintenance needs, including the two types of roofs and the windows in the classrooms and office at the Parish Center.

CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED Ouestion:

What's the story behind the Advent wreath?

Answer:

Each liturgical calendar season has its own local and regional rituals. During Advent, wreaths adorn church sanctuaries and family dining room tables. You may have said Advent wreath prayers in childhood or taken a turn lighting the candles. The Advent wreath is full of symbolism about Christ and his coming at Christmas. The wreath is made of evergreen boughs, reminding us that the life of grace doesn't falter with the changing seasons. It always remains fresh and new. Similarly, a circular wreath reminds us of the eternal, neverending nature of God's love.

Candles remind us that Christ is the light of the world, the One who "shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." We use four candles to represent each week of Advent. Traditionally, they come in the liturgical colors of the season. Purple has historically represented penance and sacrifice. We see the same color for the season of Lent. However, we light a rose color on the third Sunday of Advent. The priest will wear rose vestments at Mass. This is Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin. We're roughly halfway through the season on the third Sunday of Advent. The Church chooses the midpoint to remind us to celebrate in the midst of our anticipation! Whatever the color and whatever the day, the Advent wreath is a beautiful practice to focus our attention on Christ's coming at Christmas.

My ex threatens to take me to court and continually hassles me. My ex sabotages plans for the kids and is turning them against me. Will this ever end?

What does it look like?

I notice, or my friend tells me that their ex is still super angry and is looking for revenge. Their ex spreads lies or tells overly personal information to people in their life (friends, children's teacher, family, etc.) to embarrass or discredit them, or so people side with the ex.

What's a Safe Action?

What's a healthy sign?

Partners part ways and move on with respect to the decision that was made to break up. They make what is best for their children their priority.




For the participants of the Blessed Virgin's Rosary


